Eric A. Klein, M.D.

Eric A. Klein, MD is the Andrew C. Novick Distinguished Chair of the Glickman Urological and Kidney Institute and Professor of Surgery in the Lerner College of Medicine of the Cleveland Clinic. Following undergraduate training at Johns Hopkins University, he was a *cum laude* graduate of the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. He subsequently completed residency training in Urology at the Cleveland Clinic and a fellowship in Urologic Oncology at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He joined the staff of the Cleveland Clinic in 1989 and currently serves as a member of the Department of Cancer Biology of the Cleveland Clinic Lerner Research Institute, the Taussig Cancer Institute, and the Genitourinary Malignancies Program in the Case Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Dr. Klein is a member of numerous professional societies and scientific advisory boards including the Board of Scientific Counselors – Clinical Sciences and Epidemiology of the National Cancer Institute, the American Association of Genitourinary Surgeons, the Clinical Society of Genitourinary Surgeons, the Society of Urologic Oncology, the Society of Pelvic Surgeons, the American College of Surgeons, the American Society of Clinical Oncology, and the American Urological Association. He served as President of the Society of Urologic Oncology from 2009 - 2011.

Dr. Klein's clinical and research interests cover all stages of prostate cancer with a focus on genomics and clinical trials. Under his direction, the Prostate Cancer Research Program has been recognized as "Program of the Year" by the Cleveland Clinic. He has served as Chairman of the Localized Prostate Cancer Committee of the Southwest Oncology Group and was the National Study Coordinator for the NCI-sponsored Selenium and Vitamin E Cancer Prevention Trial (SELECT). Dr. Klein has contributed more than 600 papers to the scientific literature, authored or edited 8 books on urologic malignancies, and serves as the Editor-in-Chief of *Urology*. He has delivered more than 200 invited scientific lectures

including 13 named lectureships, and has served as a Visiting Professor at more than 60 institutions around the world. Dr. Klein was awarded the F. Mason Sones Innovation Award by the Cleveland Clinic in 2009, The Joe V. Meigs Award by the Society of Pelvic Surgeons in 2013 and 2015, was named the Kidney Foundation of Ohio's Person of the Year in 2017, and has received 3 Career Achievement Awards including a 2014 Presidential Citation from the American Urological Association, the 2014 Huggins Medal from the Society of Urologic Oncology, and the 2015 Philip S. Hench Award from the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. He is currently co-leader of the Cleveland Clinic Lerner Research Institute-designated Prostate Cancer Center of Excellence.

VICTOR F. MARSHALL VISITING PROFESSORSHIP

The visiting professorship was established by the faculty and past residents of the Weill Cornell Medicine – The New York Presbyterian Hospital, Department of Urology, to honor our distinguished colleague and leader Dr. Victor F. Marshall.

Dr. Victor Marshall came to The New York Hospital – Cornell University Medical College from Culpepper, Virginia by way of Washington and Lee University and the University of Virginia Medical School. Dr. Marshall completed his surgical and urologic training at The New York Hospital and in 1946 joined its urologic staff. In 1948, Dr. Marshall became Surgeon-in-Chief of (Urology) at The New York Hospital, a position he held until 1976. He developed the residency into one of the truly outstanding urologic training programs in the work. Its graduates, “his boys”, have gone out to fill many academic chairs in national and international urology, as well as to render superb urologic care to their communities.

Dr. Marshall was a prolific author with more than two hundred publications to his credit. In addition to this, Dr. Marshall was an active member of many urologic societies including the American Board of Urology, which he was President. He received the Ramon Guiteras Medal of the American Urologic Association, the Barringer Medal of the American Association of Genito-Urinary Surgeons and the Valentine Award of the New York Academy of Medicine.

We honor Dr. Marshall by joining together our distinguished visiting professor, the past and current faculty and residents of the Department of Urology to demonstrate and discuss surgical and diagnostic techniques in a collegial atmosphere.
